# Minutes of the 6<sup>th</sup> State Broadband Committee (SBC) Meeting of Assam.

The State Broadband Committee (SBC) of Assam was reconstituted under the chairmanship of Shri Syedain Abbasi, the Additional Chief Secretary (IT) to Govt of Assam, vide notification No. IT/71/2022-Admin-IT-IT Department 15<sup>th</sup> Feb 2023, for effective monitoring and evaluation of the work of National Broadband Mission (NBM) in Assam. The Mission has been planned with the objective of seamless, high-speed, quality and affordable broadband connectivity to all.

The  $6^{th}$  SBC meeting was held on  $26^{th}$  Sept, 2023 at 4 PM. The meeting was chaired by Additional Chief Secretary (IT) to the Govt. of Assam. The list of members / participants is attached in <u>Annexure-A</u>

The meeting started with the welcome address by Shri S.K Verma, the Addl. DGT, DoT Assam LSA. After having a brief round of introductions, the DoT expressed concern regarding nonattendance of the designated Members (as notified) in the SBC meetings. The Chair took a serious note of this and assured due compliance from the next meeting indicating the importance of this SBC meetings in view of special thrust from the Central Govt. National Broadband Mission and the PM's PRAGATI reviews. Thereafter, a detailed presentation was given by DoT, Assam LSA on various important issues as per following agenda:

The points discussed & decisions taken are stated as below:

1. <u>Review of salient points of last SBC</u>: DoT has remarked that most of the action points of 5 <sup>th</sup> SBC were complied, and remaining points are being covered in the present deliberations.

#### 2. 5G Roll out - Initiatives Reqd:

a. Creation 5G Form and integration of State RoW portal : the required integration work is still pending due to the Bank Account issue related DITEC. The Chairman instructed to sort out the issues and get the the 5G Form activated latest by 15<sup>th</sup> October 2023. Subsequently, for all municipal boards/urban local bodies, the account details are to be provided to IT department/DITEC for the purpose of revenue sharing provision against utilisation of street furniture for telecom purpose.

# (Action by IT deptt & Urban Development Deptt, Govt of Assam)

**b.** GIS mapping of street furniture: IT department to coordinate with concerned line departments (APDCL, Urban Local bodies etc.) for initiating required actions. A format for monitoring the progress of GIS Mapping of the Street Furniture has been already circulated. **One workshop** is to be organised by the State Govt. IT-Department for all the concerned line departments where a team from NBM/DoT, HQ will be invited for sharing the experiences and help guiding the State for faster rollout and accomplishment of this work in the State. The State IT-Department would finalize the date & venue of the said Workshop and convey to the DoT.

c. Implementation of DoT Right of Way (RoW) Policy Amendment 2023: The state govt. would review

and ensure necessary implementation & incorporation of various amendments in its RoW policy in concordance with the Central RoW.

**Initiatives Required**: The **5G Working Committee**, constituted for the specific purpose, vide Assam Govt. Notification, dated: 15<sup>th</sup> Dec,2022, would take up these above stated aspects along with other related issues at the earliest and ensure compliance for facilitating faster rollout of 5G services in the state in a structured manner.

b. However, it has been observed that the major agencies involved in actual excavation (Digging) works, viz., PWD (Roads), PWD (B & NH), GMC & GMDA, are seen not at all using the CBuD app. The chair, citing the importance of the App being monitored by the PMO, directed the concerned State Agencies to adhere to the standing CBuD instructions without fail.

**c**. A special thrust was given to the Department of Housing and Urban Affairs (DoHUA) for ensuring mandatory usage of CBuD App without fail by all urban local bodies involved in digging across the state.

**d**. It was also pointed out by DoT that the state govt is also to ensure issuance of required Notification in line with the Central Govt. for mandating the use of CBuD platform by all concerned Agencies without any lapse.

#### 7. Issues of DIPA/COAI:

**c**. <u>COAI Issues</u>: Many issues flagged by COAI have been covered in the above discussions. However, two major points required State's supports are stated below:

- i. Implementation as per Ministry of Power's notification on Green Open energy access consolidation.
- ii. Implementation as per Ministry of Power's advisory on common electricity billing for telecom infrastructure.

The chairman requested inputs/references from DoT/LSA and directed IT Department to write to the concerned Regulator for implementing the above instructions as requested by COAI.

#### d. DIPA Issues:

i. DIPA has raised that issue of Undue Demand from Local Bodies: In this regard, the Chair has directed DoHUA to issue guidelines to all Urban local bodies to act as per rules only.

ii. Further, DIPA has flagged few issues related to RoW & Electricity (APDCL) matters for necessary consideration from the state Govt as stated below:

- Refund of the Fee in case the application is rejected /telecom infrastructure is not able to be installed in case of public issue.
- Common duct to be provisioned in the state ROW guidelines.
- Separate policy provisions to encourage IBS.
- Electricity faults are delayed in restoration by the DISCOM even after registration of Complaints at the DISCOM call centre.
- Defective Meters are not replaced timely by the Discom thereby increasing the dispute towards average billing.
- EB tariff should be changed at Industrial Rates instead of Commercial Rate.
- One company one bill to be encouraged for online payment of electricity bills.
- Smart/ Prepaid Electricity meters to be installed at the telecom sites which need special attention to expedite.

#### 8. DCRI - State Ranking/ Completion of DCRI Data submission by the State Govt. :-

a. The chair has directed the IT department to convene a separate meeting with all the concerned departments to form the Interdepartmental Coordination Committee (IDCC) for operationalization of DCRI framework at the earliest. As many activities as discussed above have the bearings on DCRI State Ranking, the state (IDCC) would give necessary thrusts on the grey areas.
