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Minutes of 4th meeting of Delhi State Broadband Committee (SBC)

The 4th meeting of Delhi State Broadband Committee was held on 13.09.2022 at 11:30 AM under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary, GNCTD. The meeting was attended by DG (Telecom), Sr DDG (Delhi LSA), Officers of GNCT and DoT, officers of various authorities and industry representatives. (List of participants at Annex-I).

2. Secretary (IT) welcomed all the committee members and thereafter DDG (R), Delhi LSA, DoT started discussions on agenda items including decisions and present status of all items discussed in the 3rd State Broadband Committee (SBC) meeting held on 28.03.2022 (Copy of PPT at Annexure-II).

3. DDG(R) elaborated the functions of SBC as envisaged in the National Broadband Mission (NBM) document along with targets assigned vis-à-vis status of Delhi. DDG(R) stressed that growth of telecom will benefit the State in GDP as well as direct and indirect revenue collections. The details on deliberations/ discussions and decisions taken with action plan are as given below:

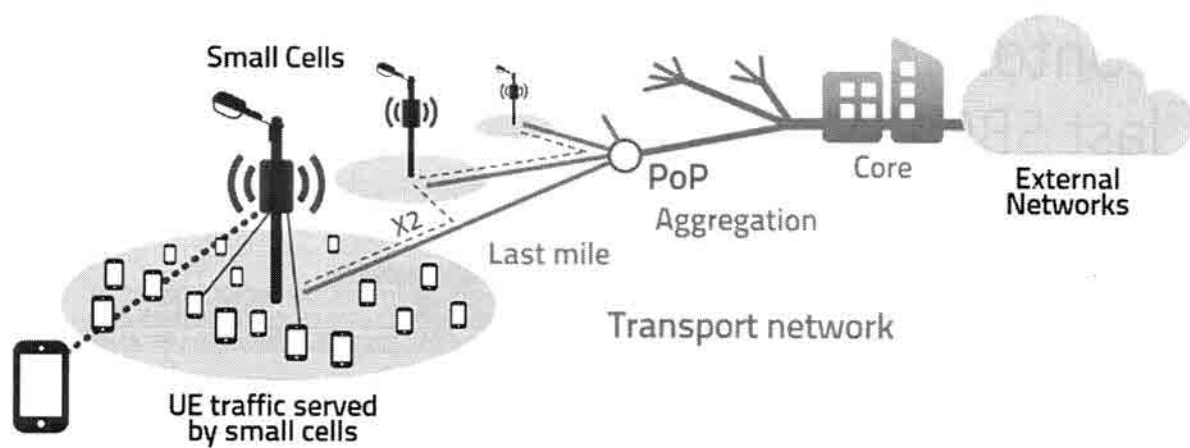
Contribution of 5G

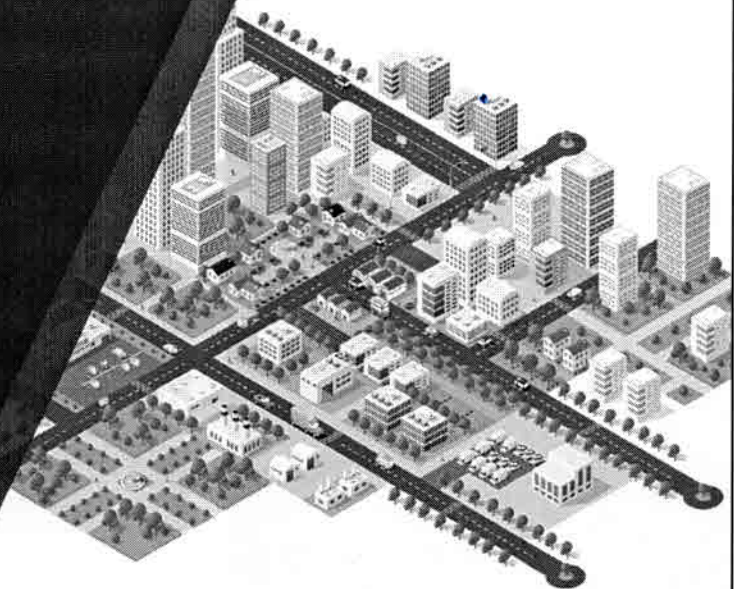

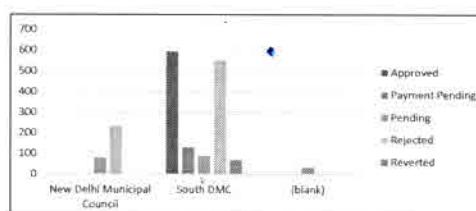

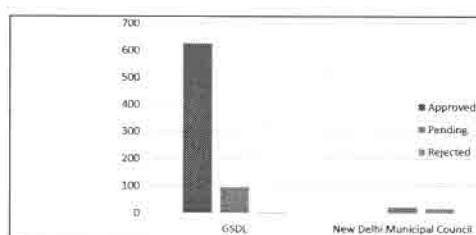
